What is Quizlet?

Quizlet is a free website providing learning tools for students, including flashcards, study and game modes. It was created by high school sophomore Andrew Sutherland in 2005 and now contains over **400 million** study sets. All of the material is user-generated.

What can it do?

- Teachers can create unique flashcards suited for their students.
- Teachers can browse the millions of flashcard sets already created and then add that set to their class.
- Teachers can print flashcards in five different layouts, in three easy steps.
- Teachers can also print a written quiz/test to give in class.

What can students do on Quizlet.com ?

STUDY! Students can track their progress with 6 powerful study and game modes!

Flashcards—Review material, shuffle/randomize, listen with audio.

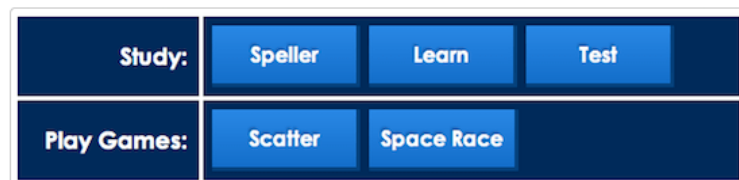
Speller—Type is heard in this audio-powered study mode.

Learn—Track correct/incorrect answers and retest missed words.

Test—Randomly generate tests based on the flashcard set.

Scatter—Race against the clock to drag and match terms/definitions.

Space Race—Type in the answer as terms/definitions scroll across the screen.



** With the Mobile App students can access the cards you create online.



Teacher Instructions

- Go to Quizlet.com

- **Sign Up** for an account. Write down the username and password so it can be communicated to others.

- **Add a class:** Click on the Add a Class button on the left hand side of the screen. Add all the classes that you want/need.

Printing study aids on Quizlet

Step 1: Choose mode

Printing 3 X 5 cards is a little bit different. See below.

Step 3: How to print

If your printer has a special "duplex" option, you can use it to automatically print double-sided.

However for most printers, you need to:

1. Print the "odd-numbered" pages first
2. Feed the printed pages back into the printer
3. Print the "even-numbered" pages

If your printer prints pages *face up*, you may need to tell your printer to reverse the order when printing the even-numbered pages.

Printing a Test Using Quizlet

Printing a test is another option found on the same page as the printing of study aids. Click the words “Want to print a test? Click here.”

Quizlet in the Classroom

1. Take students to the media center and use the PC computers to access Quizlet.com and students can learn the vocabulary words, test on the vocabulary words, play Scatter, play Space Race, or print cards.
2. Check out the mobile lab and bring the laptops to your classroom. Have students access Quizlet.com and students can learn, test, play Scatter play Space Race, or print cards.
3. With one computer and a projector show definitions on screen and have students say the vocabulary word out loud.
4. With one computer and a projector show definitions on screen and have students write the vocabulary term.
5. Create a quiz online, print the quiz and make copies. Hand out in class in the traditional way.
6. Create a quiz online, print the quiz then show it on the document camera. Pair students up and have them discuss the correct answer.
7. Create a quiz online, check out the mobile lab and have students take the quiz online.
8. Embed the flashcards on your website and students can practice from home.
9. Tell students about the Quizlet app. Allow them to download your cards in class and put students into groups using student's mobile devices.
10. Print out cards and have students study vocabulary words in the traditional way.
11. Check out two laptops. Divide students into two teams and take turns playing scatter. First team to finish earns one point.
12. Same as number 11 but play Space Race.
